BSN Completion Program

St. Luke’s College offers an RN-BSN program designed to enrich the academic and professional experiences of the registered nurse. The program provides the knowledge and skills necessary to manage and coordinate care for diverse individuals, families and communities. Coursework emphasizes collaborative quality management, health promotion strategies and leadership skills. The RN-BSN completion program provides students with flexible full and part time scheduling with courses delivered **100% online**.

Credit Hours and Requirements

- Registered nurses may transfer previous coursework from associate degree or diploma programs (up to 90 credit hours)
- 120 credit hours are required to complete the BSN degree
- A minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed at St. Luke’s College
- All coursework will be evaluated for transfer credit upon receipt of official college transcripts

Personalized Plan of Study

The RN-BSN program is designed for the working RN. At St. Luke’s College we understand the importance of balancing college coursework with other life responsibilities. Each student is assigned a faculty advisor who will help you create a personalized schedule that works for you, including a self-driven clinical practicum experience.

Transfer Guide - ICCC

Students entering the field of Nursing can transfer to St. Luke's College to complete the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree. St. Luke's will accept credits from Iowa Central Community College's Associate Degree Nursing Program (transfer courses must be completed with a grade of at least "C"). Students must obtain licensure as a Registered Nurse within one semester. Credits are calculated as follows:
